We operate a number of Community Transport projects, including Dial a Ride and Community Car Services, providing transport for the most vulnerable members of our community.

Our primary purpose is to provide affordable and accessible door to door services to those who would otherwise find it difficult to use public transport. In fact we enable access to local services, community engagement, promoting better health, access to preventative support groups, a greater sense of positive wellbeing and supporting our passengers highly valued independent living.

Whilst our Dial a Ride service provides day to day journeys our Community Car Service supports those traveling further afield, in particular to attend hospital appointments.

They believe that Jo's killing was aimed at dividing us - and that there is no better response to that than a public showing of unity. They hope to show that no matter what party your vote for, where you come from or how you voted in a referendum - there is more that unites us than divides us.

As such they are asking people to take part in 'The Great Get Together' by holding events on the 17 and 18th of June (the 16th is the actual anniversary) from street parties and picnics to shared barbecues and community bake offs with the aim of building one of the UK's biggest ever community events.

Dear One Suffolk Customer,

It's been a little while now since we last contacted you and we thought now was a good time to update you on progress on the One Suffolk/Silverstripe upgrade process.

Whilst we are not quite in a position yet to formally confirm when the upgrade will be completed, we can now give you an update on our plans and what we have been doing the past few months.

Over the past 3-4 months we have been beavering away testing and putting in place a number of parts of the upgrade. We can confirm that we intend to upgrade the version of Silverstripe that One Suffolk uses to 3.6 (from 2.4.5).

To date we have been working on building the architecture of the upgraded system, new modern, mobile and tablet friendly themes (which are complete), we have virtually completed the new main One Suffolk website design and build and we have successfully upgraded a number of the functions (modules) that One Suffolk uses like Polls, Events etc to the new version on our test systems.

Our remaining tasks are to complete the upgrade of all the remaining core modules (or functions), plan out the migration of the sites from the old to the new system and tidy up some of these activities we have already started work on.

I'm sure many of you are keen to know timescales but at this stage all we can say is that we are committed to ensuring that it will be place before our 1 year anniversary of taking over the service on November 1st. In reality my belief is that it will be far sooner than that as we are making good progress. My hope is that within the next 2-3 months we will be able to confirm the upgrade schedule and then within 2 months of this we will be able to complete this process and all One Suffolk websites will be on the upgraded system.

The reality of the task is that it is a very large task and one, had the service remained with Suffolk County Council, would probably never have happened due to the cost and size of the task. From day 1 Community Action Suffolk has been committed to the upgrade and we believe once you see some of the new modern themes that you will all have access to, you will be very pleased!

We hope you appreciate the update and we will update you when we have further information. Feel free to forward this email to anyone else who is involved with your One Suffolk website if you think it will be of benefit to them.

## Why has Screen Suffolk been created?

Screen Suffolk has been created to [put Suffolk on the screen industries map](#). We have so much to offer in Suffolk – stunning locations, a wealth of creative talent – but the county isn't well known within the industry. Film-makers are increasingly looking to film outside London, taking work, business, and budgets to other regions. The digital industries are also growing fast. We know that filming and related activities can bring significant direct and indirect benefits to a region, so Screen Suffolk has been established to attract these benefits to Suffolk.

## Our approach

Our mission is to make Suffolk the most film-friendly county in the UK. We have over a decade of experience working with local authorities to manage filming, and our approach is very much to aim for win/win outcomes; resident engagement is important to us, as is protecting the locations we manage and ensuring they are used in a sustainable way. ## A county-wide one-stop film service
